PAPER CUBE COLLAGE

with Jessica Trevizo Inspired by Jean-Michel Basquiat



Hello! Today we'll be working on a piece of art inspired by the artist Jean-Michel Basquiat. We'll be looking at Untitled, 1985, printed paper collage on painted wooden box, $11 \frac{1}{4} \times 85/8 \times 85/8$ in. which is part of the Nasher's Collection.

Who was Jean-Michel Basquiat? Basquiat was a young, Brooklyn-born artist of Haitian and Puerto Rican descent who was known for using collage elements, including lists of animals as well as metals and other substances; anatomical drawings, grimacing figures; and repeated use of the copyright symbol ©. Basquiat's art brought together unexpected references to science, art, literature, and Black culture.

Let's get started making your own version, inspired by your interests and favorite things.

Materials:

- Cube template
- Scissors
- Glue
- Any wet or dry media you have at home (colored pencils, crayons, watercolors)
- Black pen or marker
- Collage materials (old magazines, books or newspapers)

Steps:

- 1. Print the cube template on an 8.5"x11" sheet of paper.
- 2. Collect all your supplies for creating your collage. Any wet or dry media and collage materials.
- 3. Drawing inspiration from Basquiat's piece, look for images of things you like in your collage materials. It can be anything.
- 4. Cut the images out and glue them to the squares of the cube. You don't have to fill in every square.
- 5. Next, inside a few squares draw your favorite animals or things. The drawings can overlap with the images you've glued on.
- 6. Using a black pen/marker, find a place to make a list of your favorite foods. The list can overlap with other drawings/images on your squares.
- 7. Are the squares getting pretty filled up? Use your crayons or watercolors to fill in some empty spaces.
- 8. Add a copyright symbol © anywhere on the cube.
- 9. Now you're ready to cut out your cube and put it together. Cut on the solid lines.
- 10. Fold on the dotted lines.
- 11. Glue it together using the tabs.

Great job! You've just created a Basquiat-inspired collage cube.
