

Nasher Sculpture Center Garden Guide





Dragonflies


Bamboo

Bamboo can grow as much as 30 cm (1 foot) per day!




Cedar Elm

The magnolia is named after French botanist, Pierre Magnol. He admired the tree so much that he transplanted it to Europe 300 years ago.












CardinalOnly male cardinals have bright red feathers.

Crape Myrtle


Un-be-LEAF-able!

Artists can be inspired (or get great ideas from) nature too!


